

NOTICE TO THE BAR

MULTICOUNTY LITIGATION APPLICATION FOR DESIGNATION OF NEW JERSEY STATE-COURT CASES INVOLVING TALC-BASED BODY POWDER PRODUCTS USED FOR FEMININE HYGIENE PURPOSES

The Supreme Court has received an application pursuant to Directive #08-12, "Revised Multicounty Litigation Guidelines," for Multicounty Litigation (MCL) designation of New Jersey state-court litigation involving alleged personal injuries resulting from use of talc-based body powder products for feminine hygiene purposes. The litigation is against Johnson & Johnson; Johnson & Johnson Consumer Companies, Inc.; Imerys Talc America, Inc., f/k/a Luzenac America; and Personal Care Products Council ("PCPC") (formerly known as the Cosmetics, Toiletries, and Fragrances Association or CTFA).
