The Constitution establishes a framework for government that provides limits and guardrails, including our representative government, jury service, and a regular Census. And through this commitment to unity, we all provide for the common good through government responses to national responses to crises and natural disasters, and through community and advocacy programs for students and adults."

Video Contest:	This contest is open to Essex County students in grades K-12. Contest rules and registration forms are available online. Video submissions must be submitted with written lyrics, script or description in a Word document or in the body of an email along with the recording of the performance and emailed to EssexLawDay.Mbx@njcourts.gov between Feb. 24 to March 14, 2025 (5 minutes maximum for each entry). Mock Trial Program:	 Mock Trial Program is open to all Essex County students in grades 3 through 12. Students stage a mock trial to resolve a hypothetical dispute outlined in a court prepared fact pattern. This activity develops students' analytical abilities and self-confidence while furthering an understanding of the content, processes, and roles of courtroom staff as well as the legal system. Mock trials also demonstrate the significance of our constitutional protections and promotes trust in the courts. The Law Day Committee, in partnership with the Office of the Ombudsman and the Essex County Bar Association (ECBA), coordinate the mock trials. Judges and members of the ECBA will visit participating schools/groups to assist, mentor and participate in the mock trials. Interested schools and groups must register to participate. All mock trials will be held on Friday, May 2, 2025. To ensure that presenters and attendees have sufficient time to interact with each other, it is recommended that schools/groups allot at least two class periods or 40 minutes to 1 ½ hours to conduct mock trials. Please note this is not a competition. It is a learning exercise in which the students need to be prepared in advance to participate. Please refer to our Mock Trial Guide for additional information. Guest Judge Speaker:	Guest Judge Speaker is an alternative program offered to those schools who do not wish to conduct a mock trail and prefer to have a judge meet with the students and discuss a requested topic or the role of the judge and the courts. Presentations will be hosted <u>virtually</u> via the schools preferred virtual platform. Registered schools will be contacted in April 2025 to arrange a date and time. <i>The date will be coordinated based on judge's availability in April or</i> <u>May 2025</u> .
