Pretrial Services internship tasks statewide:

- **Daily interactions with stakeholders**
 - Judges, prosecutors, public defenders, private attorneys, law enforcement, county jails and the public.
- **Clerical Responsibilities**
 - Retrieve voicemails
 - Generate notices
 - Research caseloads
- **Speak with defendants**
 - Initial defendant contact/intake
 - Verify treatment
 - Public defender applications
- **Staff court events**
 - Central Judicial Processing (first appearances)
 - Detention Hearings
- **Provide community resource referrals**
 - Social
 - Emotion
 - Rehabilitative
