Criminal Justice Reform is a non-monetary bail system that uses a variety of risk factors to determine release eligibility. Pretrial goals are to ensure community safety and ensure that defendants appear in court remain arrest-free while on pretrial release. Criminal Justice Reform in New Jersey continues to evolve.

Pretrial Services staff responsibilities include:

- **Daily interactions with stakeholders**
 - Judges, prosecutors, public defenders, private attorneys, law enforcement, county jails and the public.
- **Conduct pretrial risk assessments**
 - Run criminal histories.
 - Make recommendations.
 - Draft release orders.
- **Monitor defendants**
 - Low- to high-risk levels
 - Home detention with or without electronic monitoring.
 - Ensure compliance with court orders.
- **Staff court events**
 - Central Judicial Processing (first appearances).
 - Detention hearings.
- **Work non-traditional work weeks**
 - Holidays, weekends, and emergent on-call duties
- **Provide community resource referrals**
 - Social
 - Emotional
 - Rehabilitative
