Criminal Justice Reform is a non-monetary bail system that uses a variety of risk factors to determine release eligibility. Pretrial goals are to ensure community safety and ensure that defendants appear in court remain arrest-free while on pretrial release. Criminal Justice Reform in New Jersey continues to evolve.

Pretrial Services staff responsibilities include:

Daily interactions with stakeholders

 Judges, prosecutors, public defenders, private attorneys, law enforcement, county jails and the public.

Conduct pretrial risk assessments

- Run criminal histories.
- Make recommendations.
- Draft release orders.

Monitor defendants

- Low- to high-risk levels
- Home detention with or without electronic monitoring.
- Ensure compliance with court orders.

Staff court events

- Central Judicial Processing (first appearances).
- Detention hearings.

· Work non-traditional work weeks

- Holidays, weekends, and emergent on-call duties

Provide community resource referrals

- Social
- Emotional
- Rehabilitative
