

THIS MATTER being opened on the court's own motion, and it appearing that in the past all *pro hac vice* applications have required a schedule attached listing all the docket numbers of all the cases for which the attorney is seeking admission. Though one omnibus motion is filed, the court staff enters the motion in the court computer system for each individual case and a fee is charged per case. When the application is granted or denied, the court signs an Order which is then returned to counsel who makes sufficient copies of the Order to place in each case file. This has created a delay in closing out the motions entered in these case as a result, and for good cause shown;

IT IS on this 25<sup>th</sup> day of April, 2012, **ORDERED** that in the future the court staff will enter the Order granting or denying the *pro hac vice* motion in each case in the computer, but only the original paper motion and Order need be submitted and this Order with the attached schedule will be placed in the master file with the paper copy of the notice of motion, and counsel will not be required to send in additional orders. A motion fee will still be charged for each case that is listed in Schedule A.
