ORDERED that, in the alternative, Plaintiff shall secure a reasonable office location for deposition closer to Plaintiff's residence so that the subject deposition may occur no later than April 10, 2024 on a date, time and location to be agreed upon by the parties; and it is further

ORDERED that in the event Plaintiff chooses to be deposed outside of New Jersey, <u>i.e.</u> at a location closer to her residence consistent with this order, Plaintiff shall be responsible for payment of all expenses, costs and fees associated with counsel for Defendants' appearance at deposition, including, but not limited to, reasonable travel expenses, reasonable lodging expenses, and all other reasonable expenses associated with the deposition; and it is further

ORDERED that counsel for Defendants shall serve a copy of this order on all parties within 5 days of the date of this order.
