NOTICE TO THE BAR

Dismissal of General Equity Cases for Lack of Prosecution (Rule 1:13-7)

Effective September 1, 2008, Rule 1:13-7(a) was amended to provide that the

court may send out notices of dismissal for lack of prosecution in General Equity cases

after 60 days of inactivity and may dismiss those cases 30 days after the date of such

notice if no required action is taken. This process is being automated and will be

operational by the end of September 2008. Thus, the initial pool of automated dismissal

notices in General Equity cases likely will be generated and mailed before the end of

September. As provided in Rule 1:13-7(a), litigants may avoid dismissal by taking one

of the actions set forth in paragraph (c) of the rule within 30 days of the date of the

dismissal notice.
