TRAINING/RESOURCE MATERIALS TO ASSIST ATTORNEYS ASSIGNED PRO BONO DOMESTIC VIOLENCE CONTEMPT MATTERS

Chief Justice Stuart Rabner last year formed a working group to develop training and resource materials for pro bono attorneys assigned to represent a defendant charged with contempt of a domestic violence restraining order. The training materials are intended to provide guidance to attorneys assigned these mandatory pro bono cases so that they may provide effective representation for their assigned clients.

Although it was developed to assist pro bono attorneys, private defense counsel or prosecutors involved in litigating a domestic violence contempt case also may find the manual helpful.
