MASS TORTS – PROPOSED TERMINATION OF MASS TORT DESIGNATION AND CENTRALIZED MANAGEMENT OF THE MAHWAH TOXIC DUMP SITE LITIGATION

By Order of November 27, 2007, the Supreme Court designated all New Jersey state-court litigation involving the alleged Mahwah Toxic Dump Site as a mass tort and assigned it to Bergen County for centralized management by Superior Court Judge Jonathan N. Harris. On July 14, 2009, the Court reassigned all such matters to Superior Court Judge Brian R. Martinotti. Judge Martinotti has reported to the Administrative Director of the Courts that all active litigation has been concluded. On this basis and in accordance with the provisions of the “Revised Mass Tort Guidelines” (Directive #7-09) and *Rule* 4:38A, Judge Martinotti recommends that the mass tort designation and centralized management of the Mahwah Toxic Dump Site Litigation be terminated.

This Notice is to advise of the proposed termination of the mass tort designation and centralized management of the New Jersey state-court Mahwah Toxic Dump Site Litigation. Any comments on or objections to this proposed action must be submitted in writing, with relevant supporting documentation, to the Administrative Director of the Courts, P. O. Once this comment period has closed, the proposed termination of the mass tort designation will be submitted to the Supreme Court for its consideration and action.
