NOTICE TO THE BAR

PROPOSED REVISION TO RECORDS RETENTION SCHEDULE – BAR APPLICATION AND CHARACTER COMMITTEE FILES

The Supreme Court has received a proposal to reduce the retention period for bar application files, which includes Character Committee files, from the current permanent retention to a 35-year retention period. Before acting on the proposal, the Court directed that it be published for comment.

These bar application and Character Committee records are confidential and can only be accessed by the bar applicant or with a release from the applicant. While these records are frequently accessed by the Board of Bar Examiners up to two years after the admission process and on occasion but less frequently up to ten years after the admission process, there have been no requests for access to any of these records after 25 years. The proposal for a 35-year retention period, submitted by staff on behalf of the Board of Bar Examiners, would result over time in significant savings in storage and microfilming costs.
