SERVICE OF PROCESS – AMENDMENTS TO RULE 1:3-3 (“ADDITIONAL TIME AFTER SERVICE BY ORDINARY MAIL”) TO INCREASE TIMEFRAME FROM 3 TO 5 DAYS

The Supreme Court has amended Rule 1:3-3 (“Additional Time After Service by Ordinary Mail”) so as to increase the additional time for service of a notice or paper by ordinary mail from 3 days to 5 days. The Court’s action responds to recent changes to the timeframe for delivery of regular mail by the United States Postal Service.

The Court’s February 8, 2022 Order is attached. The Rule amendments are effective April 1, 2022.

Rule 1:3-3. Additional Time After Service by Ordinary Mail

When service of a notice or paper is made by ordinary mail, and a rule or court order allows the party served a period of time after the service thereof within which to take some action, [3] **5** days shall be added to the period.
