CYBERSECURITY & ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE: NO-COST VIRTUAL CLE PROGRAM ON DECEMBER 19, 2024

The Judiciary will provide a virtual continuing legal education (CLE) course focusing on security implications of AI and other emerging technologies. Building on the "AI and Ethics" program, legal and technology experts will share information about current cybersecurity risks and provide practical guidance for attorneys to better protect themselves and their clients. Consistent with the plan announced in this June 11, 2024 <u>notice</u>, the webinar will be offered free of cost.

This program will offer 2.0 credits in ethics/professionalism through the Judiciary's Diversity, Inclusion, and Community Engagement Program (Provider #1720).
