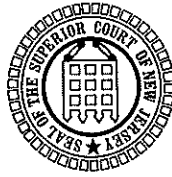

**Passaic Vicinage Committee on Minority Concerns and
William Paterson University
Present Seminar on Consequences of DWI and Other Motor Vehicle Offenses**

The Passaic Vicinage Committee on Minority Concerns and William Paterson University will present a seminar on the consequences of DWI and other motor vehicle offenses on Friday, Nov. 16 from noon to 1:30 p.m. at the university's David and Lorraine Cheng Library, 300 Pompton Rd., Wayne.

Superior Court Judge Greta Gooden-Brown, chair of the Minority Concerns Committee will introduce panel members. Speakers include Presiding Municipal Judge G. Dolph Carradino; Richard Baird, assistant director of the William Paterson University Police Department; Paul DeGroot, senior assistant prosecutor in charge of the Vehicular Homicide Unit in the Passaic County Prosecutor's Office; Dawn Rodriguez, whose daughter, Jessica Sandoval, a William Paterson University student, was killed in a reckless driving crash; and a driver convicted of DWI.

DWI simulators also will be available for audience members to use so they can experience how it looks and feels to drive while intoxicated.

This seminar is free and open to the public.

The Passaic Vicinage Committee on Minority Concerns is composed of Superior Court employees and representatives from local businesses, schools, community groups and the public. The committee develops programs that enable the court to better serve the community.
