## **Court to Sponsor Discussion on Race in Somerville**

The Advisory Committee on Minority Concerns for Somerset, Hunterdon, and Warren counties is sponsoring a free seminar, *RACE –The Power of an Illusion: A Film and Community Discussion* on Thursday, May 15, from 6 to 9 p.m. at the Somerset County Historic Courthouse, 20 N. Bridge St., Somerville.

The seminar will focus on the subject of race and how it has evolved over the centuries in the United States. The program will include a one-hour documentary film on immigration laws, U.S. Supreme Court decisions, and a history of policies about race set forth in the United States.

The seminar will be moderated by Dr. Khyati Y. Joshi, associate professor at the School of Education, Fairleigh Dickinson University. The seminar will include small- and large-group discussions of the film.
