Cumberland/Gloucester/Salem Vicinage to Host Naturalization Ceremony

The Cumberland/Gloucester/Salem Vicinage will host a naturalization ceremony to celebrate Constitution and Citizenship Day on Tuesday, Sept. 16 at 10 a.m. in the ceremonial courtroom of the Gloucester County Old Courthouse, 1 N. Broad St., Woodbury.

Assignment Judge Georgia M. Curio will preside over the event and administer the Oath of Citizenship.

"We are pleased to celebrate the United States Constitution with those who have chosen to become U.S. citizens and to embrace the rights and responsibilities embodied in our most important founding document," said Judge Curio.
