Atlantic and Cape May Vicinage to Hold Law Day Celebrations

In celebration of the 56th annual Law Day, the Atlantic/Cape May Vicinage will hold joint events with the Atlantic and Cape May County Bar Associations.

The courts and the Atlantic County Bar Association will hold a law fair in the lobby of the Atlantic County Office Building, 1333 Atlantic Ave., Atlantic City on Wednesday, April 29 from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Staff from the courts and from county and social service agencies will be available to answer questions and distribute information. A naturalization ceremony will take place adjacent to the fair at 11 a.m.

The courts and the Cape May County Bar Association will honor the 2015 mock trial team from Middle Township High School at the Cape May County Courthouse, 9 N. Main St., Cape May Court House, on Friday, May 1 at 9 a.m. After the ceremony, the students from the mock trial team will share their experiences with upcoming high school students and encourage them to participate in the mock trial program.

There also will be a law fair in the lobby of the courthouse from 10 a.m. until noon, and a blood drive will be held in the lobby from 9 a.m. until 2 p.m. Information tables will be staffed by attorneys, employees from Cape May County agencies and departments, and court personnel.

Many activities included in the ongoing One Judge-One School program, such as games and PowerPoint presentations, focused on the 2015 Law Day theme, "Magna Carta: Symbol of Freedom Under the Law." The program matches a Superior Court judge, a staff member and a representative from the county bar association with each school. This year, 24 schools participated in the program.
