Camden Vicinage to Host Court Night

The Camden Vicinage will host Court Night, a series of free informational sessions covering a range of legal topics, on Wednesday, May 18.

The sessions will begin at 6:30 and 7:45 p.m. at 6 Executive Campus, 1 S. Union Ave. in Cherry Hill. The event is held in partnership with the New Jersey State Bar Association and Foundation and the Camden County Bar Association and Foundation.

Court staff and attorneys will lead sessions covering a range of court topics such as caregiver law, child support, dealing with debt, domestic violence, landlord/tenant issues and small claims. Speakers will provide general legal information. Individual cases will not be discussed or resolved.

“The Camden Vicinage is dedicated to providing quality service to all those who come into contact with the court system, and our success in this effort depends in large part upon the public’s understanding of the court’s functions and their trust in the system. We hope the open dialogue created on Court Night will improve public access to court services and strengthen the relationship between the court and the community we serve,” said Assignment Judge Deborah Silverman Katz.
