Ocean Vicinage to Host Law Day Activities

The Ocean Vicinage, in partnership with the Ocean County Bar Association, will hold its annual Law Day celebration on Tuesday, May 1 at 12:30 p.m. in Historic Courtroom 1 of the Ocean County Courthouse, 118 Washington St., Toms River.

The keynote address will be delivered by Robert F. Williams, a professor at the Center for State Constitutional Studies, Rutgers Law School in Camden. The program will include recognition of Central Regional High School in Bayville, this year's winner of the Ocean County Mock Trial Competition.
