## **Camden Vicinage Celebrates Law Day 2018**

Assignment Judge Deborah Silverman Katz announced that the Camden Vicinage will hold its annual Law Day celebration on Friday, April 27 at 9:30 a.m. in the jury assembly room at the Hall of Justice, 101 S. 5<sup>th</sup> St., Camden.

The national theme for this year's Law Day is "Separation of Powers: Framework for Freedom."
