Camden Vicinage to Host Naturalization Ceremony

Assignment Judge Deborah Silverman Katz will administer the Oath of Citizenship to 25 new citizens from 14 countries during the Camden Vicinage's Constitution Day celebration on Monday, Sept. 17.
