Essex Vicinage Hosting Annual 'Aging Out' Youth Conference

The Essex Vicinage will host a youth conference to help adolescents and young adults who are approaching the age to transition from foster care or related services to independent living.

The conference, called "Strive to Thrive," will be held on Tuesday, May 21 from 9:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. at the Rutgers School of Law - Newark, 123 Washington St., Newark.
