## Monmouth Vicinage Celebrates Law Day

The Monmouth Vicinage, in partnership with the Monmouth Bar Association, announced the winners of its annual Law Day Art, Essay and Poetry Contest for students focused on this year's national theme as established by the American Bar Association: "Your Voice, Your Vote, Our Democracy: The 19<sup>th</sup> Amendment at 100."
