Middlesex Vicinage to Conduct Virtual Court Election Day Hearings

Superior Court judges will be available in the Middlesex Vicinage to conduct remote hearings for election challenges or issues in Middlesex County on Tuesday, July 7. This year's primary election was moved from June 2 because of the COVID-19 pandemic. Tuesday's election will be vote-by-mail as instructed at

The county clerk's office has mailed ballots to registered voters. Anyone seeking to petition the court on a voting or election issue on the date of the election can contact the Superior Court at 732-645-4300. If appropriate, the matter will be heard promptly by a designated judge, with notice to election officials. Election officials, petitioners, and attorneys will be able to appear before the designated judge by video or telephone. Voters and residents with questions about the July 7 election or who are seeking assistance on casting their vote can contact the county clerk's office and/or the board of elections.

A limited number of polling places will be open on Election Day, but voters will only be able to cast ballots in person using a provisional paper ballot.
