In celebration of Black History Month, join the Monmouth Vicinage's celebration of this year's theme: African Americans and Labor. Monmouth University Professor Hettie Williams Ph.D. will highlight Black women and the civil rights movement in New Jersey from the Great Migration through 1954.

Williams will discuss the critical role played by Black women in forging interracial, cross-class, and cross-gender alliances at the local and national level and their role in securing the passage of progressive civil right legislation in the Garden State. Superior Court Judge Lourdes Lucas will provide opening remarks.
